NOTE TO STUDENTS

It is a pleasure to welcome you to Aqsarniit Middle School. The following pages are designed to give you information that may help you be successful at Aqsarniit. We sincerely hope you will find this year interesting, rewarding, and satisfying.

At Aqsarniit School, we believe that you have the right to achieve to your maximum ability and to develop a strong sense of self-worth. Self-worth is strongly related to achievement in school and other areas, and is developed through interactions with elders, parents, teachers, other adults in the community, and peers. We all strive to accomplish this goal.

Agsarniit Middle School teaches students from Grade 6 through Grade 8. The school program is designed to provide students with skills in Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, French, Inuktitut, and Music, Life Skills, and Health.

ACTIVITIES FOR STUDENTS



All students at Agsarniit Middle School have an opportunity to develop their skills and have fun through the intramural program. Some of the activities that students may become involved in include soccer in the fall to floor hockey in the winter.

COMPUTERS.

Every classroom is equipped with at least one computer and students have access to a computer lab and program. Each class has a weekly period scheduled in the lab. Outcomes are planned for each grade level.

Weekly Rotations

For 6 weeks beginning in October, students of Aqsarniit are able to choose an activity or field of study to pursue. Students may select to learn to play guitar, keyboard, join a drama club, choir or pick from a host of other activities. There are a number of rotations planned for the school year and occur on Wednesday afternoons.

<u>Canteen:</u> Our canteen is open daily for students to purchase a healthy snack, including an assortment of juices and yogurt bars.

OUR CANTEEN

Students operate our canteen as part of our life skills program. Every classroom has a time first thing in the morning when all students can order a recess snack from our school canteen. The food items which can usually be ordered are: Juice boxes for \$2.00 each, Yogurt for \$2.00, Cereal bars for \$2.00 each and Apples for 50 cents each.

The money made from our canteen is used to buy special items for our school's many programs and extra-curricular activities.

EXPECTATIONS FOR STUDENTS

Agsarniit students will be on time (8:20am), organized, prepared for class, with all materials ready.

Agsarniit students will complete all homework and assignments.

Agsarniit students will show respect for all adults in the school, their fellow students, elders and themselves.

Agsarniit students will respect school property, the property of others, as well as their own property.

Verbal and/or physical abuse will not be tolerated. Agsarniit students will conduct themselves at all times, in a safe, and orderly manner in class, hallways, cafeteria, washrooms, changing rooms, gymnasium, library, playground, the school bus, and walking to and from school.

Agsarniit students will be courteous, using good and proper manners at

all times.

Aqsarniit students will obey the school rules and be responsible for

their actions and behavior.

Illness:

If your child is recovering from a cold or typical ailment, we ask that you keep him/her home to recover before returning to school. We do not keep recovering children indoors during the recess break. Health officials tell us that fresh air is better than recycled air for recovering students.



Students convalescing from major surgery or major illnesses are allowed to remain indoors where being outside will compromise their therapy.



Reporting Student Progress:

Each teacher keeps a record of a student's achievement on tests, class work, and homework. Student participation, behavior, and attitudes are also evaluated.

There will be four reporting periods along with 3 parent - teacher interviews; one in the fall, the winter and last in the spring. Parents should feel free to make an appointment with their child's teacher at any time to discuss the progress of their child.

Emergency Early Closings: The school does not make the decision to close schools. It is made at the IDEA office. You often hear about it before we do as it is relayed to the media first to ensure parents have ample warning.



<u>Outdoor Clothing</u>: Please make sure your child wears proper clothing for playing outdoors. Our playground is quite breezy, so be prepared for the cold, and weather changes so that your child will be comfortable outside.

Please label all clothing and footwear with your child's name.

Each year we throw out, or give away clothing worth hundreds of dollars because it is misplaced and we cannot locate the owner.



Communication Communication

Communication with home is very important and we make every attempt to keep you informed. If it is serious, or requires immediate attention, we call right away.

- 1. <u>Personal Calls</u>: Our staff makes every effort to contact parents when concerns or messages are pertinent to individual students. Please make sure that you have completed all of the information on our <u>Student Information Profile</u>. This is updated each September and helps us reach you.
- 2. <u>Discipline Referral</u>: A discipline referral sheet allows the home to be informed of discipline infractions that don't always warrant a phone call.



Students must have their teacher's permission to make calls home and are issued a phone permission card, which the office honors. Occasionally, the office calls on behalf of the student.

Parents are encouraged to contact teachers right away if there is a concern regarding behavior, attendance problems, schoolwork, relations with other children in the class, or confusing information. Children often confuse messages, so if it is not written down or if there has been no communication by telephone, check with the teacher first. The principal or vice-principal should be contacted if there are problems on the bus or on the playground.

Medication and Health Support:

We need to be informed if your child has a medical condition. Please contact the school with the information. It would be helpful if you could provide a written report from your physician.

Teachers and support staff are able to assist students with routine medication. The school is not permitted to provide or dispense any medication. It must be provided by the parents and accompanied with a written request to administer. The note should include the dosage and frequency of administration along with instructions for administering. For prescription drugs, we would like a copy of the instructions on the package.

More on extra-curricular activities:

We are very proud of our students, staff, and community members who volunteer to help us provide a very impressive variety of extra-curricular activities. This year we will be offering: Gamer's Club, Student Council, Choir, Fiddle Club, Intramural Sports, Student Council, Chess Club, Basketball Club, Judo Club, Running Club, Cooking and Sewing, Fall and Winter camps, and Homework Club. A newsletter will be sent home by mid-September informing you of the schedule for available activities.

Students who chose to participate in lunchtime activities eat their lunch in our school's kitchen from 11:30 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. under the supervision of designated staff members. If they forget their lunch, they are encouraged to eat the food that has been prepared by the Uppigaaq staff.

Lunch hour clubs and activities are held from 11:30 -12:40 p.m.



From a parent's point of view, you should expect your child to complete all homework that the teacher assigns. What criteria do teachers use when assigning homework?

- Reading and/or being read to nightly is vital.
- Homework is used to reinforce concepts and curricular outcomes.
- It is also used to give students the opportunity to <u>practice</u> what they have learned.
- Homework can also be assigned to enable students to complete work that they did not finish in class.
- Projects provide the students with research and organizational opportunities.
- Homework may be required to complete long-term projects.
- Homework assignments are often geared to the individual needs of the child. A student on an accommodated program may study fewer words or complete fewer questions than other students. Students

requiring enrichment may be presented with a more challenging problem than that given to their classmates.

Note to Parents!

Attendance is one of the most important factors contributing to student success!

Safe Arrival Program:

- Please contact the school to let us know that your child will be absent or late arriving. We are concerned about the safety of our students and want to know their whereabouts if they are not in school.
- ▼ In winter, when the weather threatens snow or extreme cold weather, listen to the radio for school cancellations or early closures.

Behavior

At certain times it may be necessary for us to contact you at home.

If your child is experiencing difficulties they will be asked to fill out a behavior form and to bring it home to be signed. Please take the time to sign the form and review with them how this behavior can be avoided in the future.

OUR TRANSFER AND REGISTRATION POLICY

To register at our school, new students should be accompanied by a parent / guardian and have with them their child's health card number, and the name, address, and phone number of their last school.

Any other information or materials should also be brought that would be helpful to us in assisting your child to adjust well to our school.

Bus Rules

- Respect and follow the school bus rules and the instructions of the bus driver.
- Walk to a seat quietly, sit down, and remain seated (facing forward) while the bus is in motion. Students are to remain seated until the bus has come to a full stop.
- Respect all other students riding on the bus. Students may need to sit two to three students per seat. Please help the bus to stay on schedule by respectfully permitting other students to share your seat.
- Help keep the bus in good repair. Students who damage seats or other equipment must pay for it.
- Travelling by bus to school is a privilege not a right.
